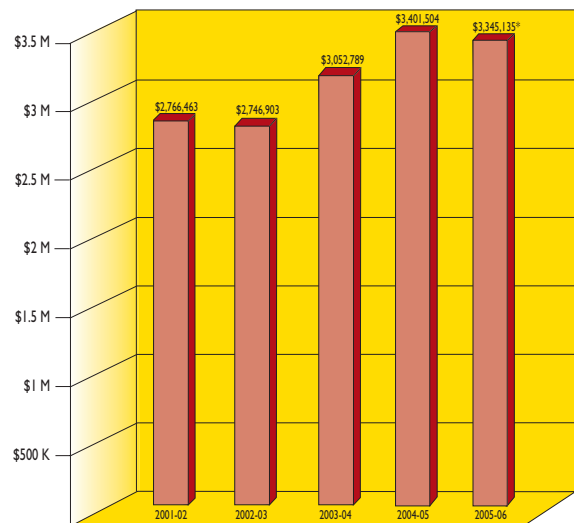


# DUEF 25+ Years of Consecutive Giving
