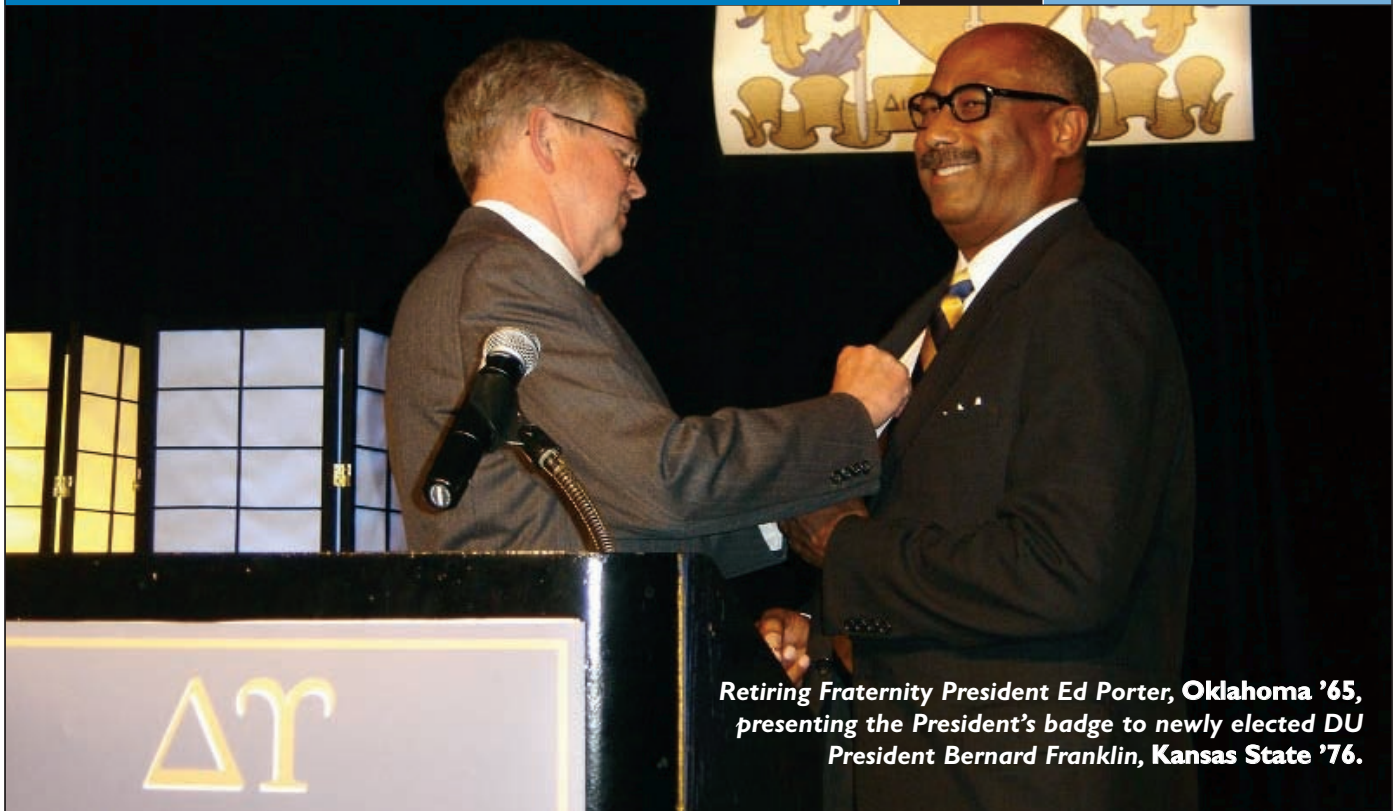


# Changing of the Guard
