Brother Smith was a long-time volunteer for Delta Upsilon and a former member of the Board of Trustees of the DU Educational Foundation. For several years he was a mainstay at the Fraternity's conferences.

He was born July 12, 1929 and grew up on a 400 acre farm in Crawford County, Indiana. He joined DU while a student at Indiana University, where he earned three degrees, all in the field of education: Bachelor's Degree in Language Arts in 1952, Master's Degree in Counseling and Guidance in 1954, and a Doctorate in Higher Education in 1964 with an outside minor in radio and television, an area that he dabbled in for many years.

He had been in the Air Force Reserve for six years and

was called to active duty with the Strategic Air Command at Omaha, Nebraska during the Korean War.

Herb spent 34 years at Indiana University, serving as Assistant Dean of Students for 20 years. He was a Past Master of the Masonic Lodge and a 50 year member of Crawford Lodge 470 in English, Indiana. He was also a 50 year member of the Scottish Rite Valley of Indianapolis and a 50 year member of the Shrine of North America. He was a Past President of the Scottish Rite Club of Monroe County, Past President of the Stone Belt Shrine Club of Bloomington. In 1994 he became the Potentate of the Murat Shrine in Indianapolis.
